Dear Prayer Partners,

Greetings to y'all from Chattanooga, Tennessee! Most of you already know that we made it safely back from Cameroon and that God has blessed us with a healthy new addition to our family! Faith Ann was born Friday morning, July 14. She weighed 7 lb 11 oz and was 20.5 inches long. After two or three blood tests came back ok, Becca and the baby were allowed to come home on Sunday afternoon. Both Becca and Faith Ann are recovering nicely at home, and we thank you all again for your diligent and fervent prayer on behalf of our family. God is so good!

We have already begun to update churches. Since the baby has been born, we have had two meetings and we already have 23 meetings scheduled from now until December. Please pray that God will give us traveling mercies and fruitful meetings. We had a great time updating one of our supporting churches in Maryland last week, and we are looking forward to the opportunity of updating another supporting church in Tennessee this coming weekend.

We have enjoyed seeing all the changes in America that we have missed while being out of the country for nearly two years. Right away we noticed several people with wireless phone receivers hanging on their ear. We have, of course, enjoyed eating out and fast food again, and we find ourselves laughing at our kids all the time as they get adjusted to things they do not remember at all. For example, when we first came back the kids would roll around and around on our living room floor just because they enjoyed the padded carpet. Around July 4 we ate some hotdogs at a friend's cook out. Drew, who does not remember ever eating hot dogs before, took his first bite and declared, "Huh, these are pretty good – they taste like chicken."☺ The hardest thing for the kids to get used to so far is the travel here in America. For weeks after we got back, the kids would ask us why we had to stop at EVERY red light. We would have to explain that in America we have traffic lights. When they are red we must stop. As soon as we would stop at the next light they would all ask again, "why have we stopped?" We don't have traffic lights in Bamenda, and we hardly stop for anything in Cameroon when we are traveling, so it will take some time for the kids to get used to following traffic laws and the smooth roads.

Please pray for the Yeiter family as they continue alone in Cameroon with all of the ministry responsibilities in our absence. They continue sending us good updates, and we rejoice in the spiritual growth of the believers there, as well as the recent souls who have received Christ as Savior. Mildred and Blessing both trusted Christ this month after reading gospel tracts we wrote, designed, and printed there in Cameroon through your faithful support. A handful of college students have been showing recent interest in our Bible studies through a recent student outreach emphasis headed up by Matt Yeiter and some people from the Bambili Bible study.

To God be the glory. We are so thankful to be in His service. Thank you again for your faithful prayers and support.
